Applying for the grant, collecting and distributing the assets

We anticipate this will take between 8 and 10 hours work from £150 per hour + VAT for a simple probate matter, with more complex matters being at a higher rate.

The exact cost will depend on the individual circumstances of the matter. For example, if there is one beneficiary and no property, costs will be at the lower end of the range. If there are multiple beneficiaries, a property and multiple bank accounts, costs will be at the higher end.

We will handle the full process for you. The above quote is only for estates where:

- There is a valid will
- There is no more than one property in the UK
- There are no more than 2 bank or building society accounts
- There are no other intangible assets
- There are no more than 2 beneficiaries
- There are no disputes between beneficiaries on division of assets. If disputes arise this is likely to lead to an increase in costs
- The overall value of the estate is within the nil rate band threshold and there is no inheritance tax payable and the executors do not need to submit a full account to HMRC
- There are no claims made against the estate

Disbursements in addition to our fee:

- Probate application fee of £215
- Swearing of the oath - £7 per executor
- Bankruptcy - only Land Charges Department searches - £2 per beneficiary

Potential additional costs

- If there is no will or the estate consists of any share holdings (e.g. stocks and bonds) there is likely to be additional costs that could vary significantly depending on the estate and how it is to be dealt with. We can give you a more accurate quote once we have more information.
- If any additional copies of the grant of probate are required, they will cost £0.50p (1 per asset usually).
- Dealing with the sale or transfer of any property in the estate is not included.

How long will this take?

On average, estates that fall within this range are dealt with within 6-8 months. Typically, obtaining the grant of probate takes 8-12 weeks. Collecting assets then follows, which can take between a further 12-16 weeks. Once this has been done, we can distribute the assets, which normally takes 2-4 weeks.
